## **Jill Moser: Sixteen Street opens at Wade Wilson Art**

Houston: Wade Wilson is pleased to announce the opening of the gallery's second one-artist exhibit of new works by Jill Moser. *Sixteen Street* opens with a reception for the artist from 6-9 pm on Friday, September 11 and will remain on view through October 24, 2009. An illustrated catalogue by Tim Maul is available.

The exhibit comprises a suite of sixteen new drawings and three paintings and represents Jill Moser's fifth gallery exhibition in her career to focus primarily on works on paper. Since her first, North Fork Drawings in 1996 at Wynn Kramarsky's in NYC, her works on paper have entered prestigious museum and public collections including The Metropolitan Museum of Art, Harvard University's Fogg Art Museum, Yale University Art Gallery, the Museum of Modern Art, the Art Institute of Chicago, The National Gallery of Art, Washington, D.C.; Harvard University's Fogg Art Museum, Yale University Art Gallery, Southern Methodist University's Art Museum in Dallas, and the Progressive Corporation, among others.

As Tim Maul observes in the catalogue essay for this exhibition: "Jill Moser is a painter who has produced drawings, prints, and even animations in pursuit of a rendered visual language. Forwarding the perpetually unfinished business of abstract painting, she suspends her audience between points of unsettling beauty, sly humor, and bracing mystery.... Every work of the artist, I believe, harbors an unseen mechanism sparking off the flicker of animation."

As Moser describes in her interview with Wade Wilson in 2007: "All of my work comes out of drawing... This sets up the field between drawing and painting that I have been investigating

ever since. What remains important in both is that the image is active in the process of describing itself.”

Last month Lincoln Center’s List Art Program released a new print commissioned by Moser to celebrate Lincoln Center’s 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Currently on view in New Acquisitions at the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston can be seen two of Jill Moser’s paintings from 2006.
